### Background:

Cunard Line is one of the world's most recognized brand names with a classic British heritage that dates back to 1840. They are known for providing legendary voyages for any lifestyle and budget to some of the most exciting destinations around the world. Currently Cunard Line fleet consists of Queen Victoria and Queen Mary 2, and will welcome Queen Elizabeth in 2010. Queen Victoria was launched in December 2007 and was named by HRH the Duchess of Cornwall. Queen Victoria set sail on her maiden voyage in January of 2008.



**Itinerary:**

Queen Victoria begins her 25-day Autumn Colours voyage in Southampton, England on September 18, 2009. After seven full days of sailing, she arrives in New York where passengers disembark the ship to enjoy two days of the big apple. Next, Queen Victoria travels on to visit Boston, Portland, and Bar Harbor before venturing into Canadian waters. On day 14 she arrives in Saint John and then cruises on to Halifax where the city celebrates the vessel's inaugural call. After departing Halifax, Queen Victoria sails the St. Lawrence Seaway to dock in Quebec City overnight. She then will make her way to her final destination of St. John's, Newfoundland before returning to her homeport in Southampton, England.
